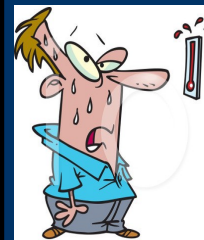

- Your child(ren) /step-child(ren) must be 18 and under.
- Live in the U.S.A.
- You are NOT subject to any court order, federal or state law or regulation, other legal requirement, or any administrative rule preventing contact with the child and/or their caregiver you plan to list on the application.
- You MUST have legal authority to allow the child's information to be used by Prison Fellowship Angel Tree ministry.

OSP Metal Shop Journeyman Machinist

OCE Program Location – *OSP Metal Shop*

The OCE Metal Shop is recruiting for an experienced machinist. Applicants must pay attention to detail and adhere to a high quality standard in a fast-paced environment while meeting deadlines. Workers must be motivated and able to maintain a professional attitude at all times. Position awards PRAS points, with the opportunity to earn a Team Goal Award. This position has opportunities for reviews, promotions and advancement. The schedule is Monday through Friday, 6:00 am to 2:00 pm.

Duties include:

- Setup and operation of conventional and specialized machining equipment
- Fabrication of metallic and non-metallic parts in a production setting
- Care of all associated equipment and clean-up daily

Skills that enhance the experience of successful applicants (not required):

- Experience with manual lathes – preferably including a working knowledge of Hercules-Ajax (18" swing), Century (20" swing) and South Bend (12" swing)
- Experience with manual milling machines – preferably including a working knowledge of both Bridgeport and Cincinnati mills vertical & horizontal machines
- Willingness to do production work and shop repairs with a mechanical aptitude
- Ability to read blueprints and drawings
- Welding experience
- Additional useful experience includes drill press use and surface grinder operation

Applicants must meet the following qualifications:

- Have a valid social security number
- Have at least six (6) months' time incarcerated with clear conduct and no program failures in the past six (6) months
- Not involved in conflicting programs or activities during the assigned shift
- Be willing to sign a twelve (12) month retention agreement
- Current OCE workers must have fulfilled at least one (1) year in current position to be eligible to apply
- Incentive level 2 or 3

Essential functions include ability to:

- Must be able to lift up to 40 lbs
- Remain standing operating machinery for extended periods of time throughout the work day
- Work in a production setting with loud background noise
- Maintain safety controls and equipment including wearing correct Personal Protection Equipment (PPE)
- Receive training and quality-control advice and corrections from other AICs and staff
- Communicate respectfully with staff, AICs and clients
- Must be a self-starter with limited direction from supervisor.

If you are interested in becoming highly marketable upon release, utilizing modern production machinery, and making a difference within OCE, DOC, and the community, this position may be what you've been looking for. All applicants will need to pass a DOC/OCE security screening and OCE interview before being considered for the position.

Corban University New Four-Year College Degree Program

Oregon Department of Corrections, Corban University and Paid In Full Oregon have partnered to bring a four-year Bachelor of Science degree program to the Oregon State Correctional Institution. Corban University is a private Christian university in Salem, Oregon, accredited by the Northwest Commission of Colleges and Universities. Paid In Full Oregon is a non-profit organization founded with the purpose of partnering with DOC and Corban University "to provide inmates a fully accredited bachelor's degree. Paid In Full Oregon is raising all the funds for this program. There will be no cost to students.

The graduates will earn a Bachelor of Science in Liberal Arts with an emphasis in Psychology, Social Service, and Leadership. This program is about transforming lives. Graduates will not remain at OSCI, rather they will be sent to other institutions to serve as mentors to others.

Twenty five students will be enrolled each year, for a maximum capacity of 100 students. Adults in custody will be transferred to OSCI from other institutions if accepted into the program. The new term is tentatively scheduled to start in September 2020. This is a voluntary program. The minimum requirements are:

- Minimum of eight years left on sentence at time of enrollment.
- Non-Cash Incentive Level of 3. Level 2s may be considered with institution review and approval, on a case by case basis.
- High school diploma or equivalent.
- Completed application
- Agreement to mentor others upon completion of degree.



We are accepting ktyes through July 7, 2021. If you meet the basic criteria listed above and wish to enroll in this program, send an Inmate Communication form to Ms. Norton, Education Manager, DOC Education, 3405 Deer Park Dr. SE-Res 1, Salem, OR, 97310. The Education staff will ensure you meet the basic criteria and then send you an enrollment application with directions on how to proceed.

Completed applications must be returned to Ms. Norton no later than July 7, 2021.

SRCI Commissary News

SRCI Commissary has been experiencing a significant increase in sales due to the Economic Impact Payments. We are working diligently to keep popular items on the shelf; unfortunately, we are still seeing delays and shortages from them and from their manufacturers. As a result of product availability issues outside of our control, the following changes will take place beginning the week of June 7th:

- Putting limits on products that are low on inventory to better allow product to be spread out throughout the facility.
- Complex rotations for a limited duration to provide each complex an opportunity to have their orders pulled and processed first. This rotation will only be offered to General Population and only for a limited time.

Our annual wall to wall inventory takes place in June so we will be not be processing orders the week of June 28 – July 2. The only exception will be Special Housing. To assist with this, all pre-sale incentive items will be suspended from May 24 – July 12. Any orders submitted for incentive items will not be processed. Normal sales of these items will resume beginning July 12, 2021. We appreciate your understanding and patience.
