**TO ALL ADULTS IN CUSTODY,**

The Governor recently announced that Oregon is revising its indoor mask requirement due to decreasing COVID-19 case rates and hospitalizations. After March 11, the statewide mask requirement will be lifted in many workplaces and public indoor spaces throughout Oregon. As you are likely aware, the Centers for Disease Control Prevention (CDC) have different masking guidelines for correctional settings, and they have not changed those guidelines at this time.

DOC is working to review all information from the CDC and prepare a plan on how to phase out masking while staying safely within CDC guidelines. Much more information to come.

COVID-19 is still in Oregon's prisons. Masks must continue to be worn, practice social distancing, and maintain sanitation protocols. Speak to Health Services about getting vaccinated or receiving a booster if you are already vaccinated. Staying cautious will help us continue to move toward returning to normal operations.

**A TODOS LOS ADULTOS BAJO CUSTODIA,**


La Gobernadora anunció recientemente que Oregón está revisando su requisito de uso de mascarillas para interiores debido a la disminución de casos y hospitalizaciones por COVID-19. Después del 11 de marzo, se levantará el requisito estatal de máscara en muchos lugares de trabajo y espacios públicos interiores en todo Oregón. Como probablemente sepas, los Centros para la Prevención y el Control de Enfermedades (CDC) tienen diferentes pautas de enmascaramiento para entornos correccionales, y no han cambiado esas pautas en este momento.

El DOC está trabajando para revisar toda la información de los CDC y preparar un plan sobre cómo eliminar gradualmente el uso de máscaras mientras se mantiene seguro dentro de las pautas de los CDC. Mucha más información por venir.

COVID-19 todavía está en las prisiones de Oregón. Se deben seguir usando máscaras, practicar el distanciamiento social y mantener los protocolos de saneamiento. Hable con los Servicios de Salud (Health Services) acerca de vacunarse o recibir un refuerzo si ya está vacunado. Mantenerse cauteloso nos ayudará a continuar avanzando hacia el regreso a las operaciones normales.

On February 19th, 2022 AICs Mixay Dethsaysongkham Don Justice, who both work in the Infirmary as orderlies, asked Officer Hicks if they could be of assistance when she noticed an AIC in medical distress. They were able to move the AIC into a laying position on his bunk to open his airway. Later they helped the responders move the AIC from his cell onto the dayroom floor to allow for more room when Medical Staff arrived.

On February 21, 2022 An AIC was having a seizure in the Dayroom. AIC Robert Turner was observed talking to him and making sure the AIC was safe during the seizure. Turner had the AIC in the recovery position and was supporting his head. A pillow was placed under the AICs head and Turner kept reassuring the AIC throughout the seizure by talking to the him and rubbing his back as he was monitoring for signs of breathing while waiting for Medical Staff to arrive.

At the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, many work assignment opportunities for adults in custody (AICs) were put on hold, and PRAS points continued to be awarded.

As DOC makes recovery plans and starts to plan for more normal operations, we will discontinue PRAS points for jobs shut down by COVID. If your job was put on hold due to COVID-19 – and you continued to receive points for that job – effective May 1st, 2021, you will no longer receive PRAS points for a position shut down due to COVID. If your position is impacted, you will be removed from the assignment and placed in a new work assignment or in a work eligible pool.

There are many work opportunities available at all DOC institutions. Please see the staff at your facility to find out what work opportunities are available.

Al comienzo de la pandemia de COVID-19, se suspendieron muchas oportunidades de asignación de trabajo para adultos bajo custodia (AIC) y se continuaron otorgando puntos PRAS.

A medida que DOC haga planes de recuperación y comience a planificar operaciones más normales, descontinuaremos los puntos PRAS para los trabajos cerrados por COVID. Si su trabajo se suspendió debido a COVID-19, y continuó recibiendo puntos por ese trabajo, a partir del 1 de mayo de 2021, ya no recibirá puntos PRAS por un puesto cerrado debido a COVID. Si su puesto se ve afectado, se le quitará de la asignación y se le colocará en una nueva asignación de trabajo o en un grupo de trabajo elegible.

Hay muchas oportunidades laborales disponibles en todas las instituciones del DOC. Consulte al personal de su centro para averiguar qué oportunidades de trabajo están disponibles.
