SRCI PHYSICAL PLANT has an opening for an Inmate Plumber position.

In order to apply, all of the following criteria must be met (no exceptions):

- Clear conduct for 1 1/2 years (No Major DR or Program Failures)
- Must already be housed in Complex 1-A, 1-B, or 1-C
- Classification 3 or less
- No history of escape, or arson
- 10 years or less remaining on sentence

You must have a good work ethic & attitude, work in team environment, follow detailed instructions, and follow operational/safety guidelines. Have basic skills in: trouble shooting, hand tools, test equipment, carpentry, plumbing/janitorial, electrical/metal fabrication, mechanical/welding, and hydraulic/pneumatic systems. Be able to install and replace pipes, valves, drain systems, basins, tubs, faucets, lavatories, sinks, gates, hydrants, water heaters, dishwashers, other plumbing fixtures, pressure valves and equipment; repair breaks in pipes; clean and open drains and other lines; repair water pumps and heaters, steam traps condense lines; install and repair steam and gas systems; troubleshoots and repair SRCI systems. Be able to work with human waste. If you are interested in this program and meet all of the above requirements, send a completed "Physical Plant Work Assignment Application" along with an Inmate Communication expressing your interest to Physical Plant (B344). The applications will be screened by members of the Physical Plant Staff. Qualified applicants will need to pass a security screening before being contacted for an interview. Submit application by May 20, 2022

SRCI PHYSICAL PLANT HAS AN OPENING FOR A PLUMBING SHOP CLERK.

In order to apply, all of the following criteria must be met (no exceptions):

- Clear conduct for 1 1/2 years (No Major DR or Program Failures)
- Must be housed in Complex 1
- Classification 3 or less
- No escape history
- 10 years or less remaining on sentence

Duties & Responsibilities:

Receive materials/parts into the facility, maintain inventory records, and dispense the materials/parts to other workers.

Must be familiar in Excel, Benchmate is used for entering Work Orders.

Skills: Efficient math, computer and communication skills to work in a stockroom or warehouse.

Excellent attention to detail, and very organized when working with inventory.

Maintain a neat and clean parts room at all times.

Administer and maintain stock of all parts/tools, evaluate all work orders, and maintain information.

Analyze and resolve all parts issues and monitor all requests.

Monitor and correct invoices if required and prepare all papers for delivery.

Administer and maintain parts inventory for assigned locations.

FROM THE ADMINISTRATIVE RULES PROGRAM:

Below is the list of status changes made to DOC administrative rules since 02/22/2022.

PROPOSED RULES:

291-209 Earned Discharge

Amends the rules to expand EDIS eligibility, revise the restitution payment requirements, add an eligibility notification requirement, and limit some crimes that will be considered for EDIS.

Last day to provide comments: 06/08/2022 at 5:00 PM

PERMANENT RULES:

291-037 Release of Public Record

Amends the rules to align with current practices, fee schedules and terminology.

Effective: 4/14/2022

291-105 Prohibited Conduct

Amends the rules to add exceptions around DSU sanctions for BHU status AICs.

Effective: 3/28/2022

291-124 Health Services (AIC)

Amends the rules to add language to allow a Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) pilot program.

Adopts fee schedule for release of AIC health records in accordance with statute.

Effective: 4/21/2022

Rulemaking comments must be provided to the DOC Rules Coordinator in writing at the address in the rulemaking notice. Communications submitted should be limited to providing comments on only one division/topic per communication. Do not include multiple divisions/topics in one communication, they will be returned. DOC notices and rules are available for review and copies in the AIC law library.

FOOD SERVICE NEWS – CHANGE TO FORTIFIED FRUIT DRINK

You may notice on the Spring-Summer 2022 menus that the Fortified Fruit Drink has moved from breakfast to lunch. The drink mix has several important vitamins added to it, including vitamin C, calcium, and vitamin D. Vitamin C is found in many fruits and in some vegetables. Vitamin C (also called ascorbic acid) is an antioxidant that promotes healthy teeth and gums. It helps the body absorb iron and maintain healthy tissue. It is also needed for wound healing. Calcium is needed in order to circulate blood, move muscles, and release hormones. Calcium is a major part of tooth and bone health as well. It makes your bones strong and dense. You can think of your bones as your body's calcium bank. If you don't get enough calcium in your diet, your body will take it from your bones. Vitamin D promotes calcium absorption, is needed for bone growth, and helps protect older adults from osteoporosis. Without sufficient vitamin D, bones can become thin or brittle. Vitamin D's other roles in the body include inflammation reduction, cell growth, immune function, and metabolism. It is difficult to get enough vitamin D from food sources alone, since there are not many foods which naturally contain vitamin D. Fortification (adding extra nutrients) of foods or beverages is a good way to ensure we all get enough. In order for the calcium and vitamin D in the drink mix to be absorbed better, we changed the drink mix to be served at lunch. There is a limit to how much of each vitamin and mineral can be absorbed by the body at one time. Milk also contains calcium and vitamin D. Serving the Fortified Fruit Drink at a different time than serving milk means the calcium and vitamin D from both sources is more likely to be absorbed. Taking the Fortified Fruit Drink at lunch, along with eating fruit and drinking milk, will help ensure that you receive enough of all three important nutrients: vitamin C, calcium, and vitamin D. And if you are out on work crew at lunch, the drink mix packet in the sack lunches will now be fortified as well. Elena Guevara RD, LD
