PREA Related Grievance & Discrimination

Complaint Process Improvements

Effective August 1, 2024, a grievance or discrimination complaint related to a claim of sexual abuse or sexual harassment will be immediately subject to investigation that is outside the Department's administrative remedies process. However, the Grievance Review System (OAR 291-109) and Discrimination Complaint Review System (OAR 291-006) can still be utilized to report PREA allegations. PREA allegations raised through these administrative review systems will receive a return receipt indicating the allegation has been received and forwarded to your institution's PREA Compliance Manager (PCM) for investigation and will include information on how to initiate PREA advocacy services. No further response or appeal will be provided through these administrative review systems. All further inquiries and communications about the PREA allegation(s) need to be sent to your institution's PREA Compliance Manager. In addition, there are many other ways to report a PREA allegation:

- In person to any staff
- Through an AIC communication form
- Call the Inspector General's Hotline

- Write to the Governor's Office

OSP Indoor Air Quality Testing

As the Department of Corrections (DOC) works to keep all who work and live in our institutions safe, we will be conducting indoor air quality testing at Oregon State Penitentiary (OSP) beginning as soon as October 10, 2024.

As you may know, OSP ran a dry-cleaning operation beginning in the late 1950s and ending in 1983. A 1989 sampling of the OSP water supply detected contamination in two wells. The use of those wells for drinking water stopped immediately, with the wells being shut down shortly thereafter. Since that time, DOC has been working with DEQ on continued groundwater testing, extraction, treatment, and monitoring.

Recently, DEQ adopted new standards for testing of indoor air quality. In accordance with the new standards indoor air quality assessments are needed to establish a baseline for future testing. Baseline testing will occur over a period of seven days and at least twice during the year. Employees and AICs will see air sampling devices in the following areas of the institution:

- Laundry
- Furniture Factory
- Call Center
- Metal shop
- 1st floor Dorm

If test results show anything of concern, DOC will work with DEQ to fix indoor air quality issues.

CORRECTIONAL REHABILITATION

NCI Incentive Level Increase

To be eligible for an early NCI Incentive Level increase:

- You must be 50% of the way towards an automatic level promotion.

- To automatically promote from NCI Level 1 to NCI Level 2, you need to have NCI Level 1 for 6 months.
- To automatically promote from NCI Level 2 to NCI Level 3, you need to have NCI Level 2 for 12 months.
- To be eligible for an early promotion from NCI Level 1 to NCI Level 2, you need to be at NCI Level 2 for 3 months.
- To be eligible for an early promotion from NCI Level 2 to NCI Level 3, you need to be at NCI Level 2 for 6 months.

If your early incentive level increase request falls outside of these timeframes (3 months or 6 months), the request will be denied and you will be directed to resubmit at the appropriate date.

Selected candidates will receive on-going training for the position through job shadowing, individual skills coaching, and ongoing staff supervision.

- Clear conduct for 1 year
- In compliance with your Oregon Corrections Plan
- Treatment compliance if you receive Behavioral Health Services yourself
- Engaged in positive, prosocial programming or activities

- Ability to attend all the required training



HEALTH SERVICES ELECTRONIC HEALTH RECORDS (EHR)

OCTOBER 2024 UPDATE

Health Services continues to ensure that your paper health records become part of your health record in the Electronic Health Records (EHR) system and our scanning partners are currently scanning any overflow charts that you may have. Overflow charts are your paper health records that date back 6 months or longer. It is important that your overflow records become part of your electronic record because it can help ensure the people who provide medical, mental health, and dental services have the most complete picture of your health history.

Scanning Process: Our scanning partners have been doing this for over 55 years and scan thousands of pages every day. When they scan your paper health records, the electronic files are safely stored, protected, and backed up on hard drives.

Privacy Matters: Your health information belongs to you, and we care a lot about your privacy. During the EHR project, keeping your information private is our focus. Health Services make sure your information is safe and only people who are allowed can see it.

Please remember that your paper health records will be kept safe and stored according to the rules that Oregon Department of Corrections Health Services carefully follows for keeping those records.
