PREA Related Grievance & Discrimination Complaint Process Improvements

Effective August 1, 2024, a grievance or discrimination complaint related to a claim of sexual abuse or sexual harassment will be immediately subject to investigation that is outside the Department's administrative remedies process. However, the Grievance Review System (OAR 291-109) and Discrimination Complaint Review System (OAR 291-006) can still be utilized to report PREA allegations. PREA allegations raised through these administrative review systems will receive a return receipt indicating the allegation has been received and forwarded to your institution's PREA Compliance Manager (PCM) for investigation and will include information on how to initiate PREA advocacy services. No further response or appeal will be provided through these administrative review systems. All further inquiries and communications about the PREA allegation(s) need to be sent to your institution's PREA Compliance Manager. In addition, there are many other ways to report a PREA allegation:

- In person to any staff
- Through an AIC communication form
- Call the Inspector General's Hotline
 - Pick up handset, make language selection, and dial "91"
- Write to the Governor's Office

 - You can request to remain anonymous.

Work Orders:

The following is the procedure when requesting plumbing work repairs in your cell housing or work location.

For your cell housing you are to notify your tier officer or Block Sergeant and give a brief explanation of your issue, staff will then submit a work order request electronically. For plumbing issues at your work location (Example) OCE, Culinary, Yard, etc. Notify your staff supervisor they will then submit a work order request electronically.

All work order requests are prioritized based on the nature of the request and current work order load. A dripping cell faucet is considered a low priority but is usually addressed within a week.

Mental Health Special Housing is now hiring for two, full-time Peer Companions on the Mental Health Infirmary (MHI) unit. The Individuals selected for this position will report to the MHI unit for their shifts. We are looking for motivated, responsible individuals who have the willingness to work with individuals unable to care for their own ADL's as well as individuals experiencing significant mental health symptoms. It is important for Unit Peer Companion candidates to behave in a manner that is respectful, safe, confidential, and honest, modeling patience, respectful communication, and the following of all unit and institution rules.

MHI Unit Peer Companions will have specific shifts and are responsible for assisting unit staff, QMHP's and treatment staff in ensuring that identified AICs housed on MHI are getting their basic and daily needs

met, which helps to improve their functioning and improve their overall quality of life while incarcerated. Duties may also include assisting individuals around ADL coaching and skill building; increasing social interactions; and guiding or accompanying individuals who have difficulty walking or who are resistant to engaging in activities outside of their cells to activities on the unit, during day room, or out for MHI yard time.

- Preferred that you have one or more years left of your sentence.



Health Services continues to ensure that your paper health records become part of your health record in the Electronic Health Records (EHR) system and our scanning partners are currently scanning any overflow charts that you may have. Overflow charts are your paper health records that date back 6 months or longer. It is important that your overflow records become part of your electronic record because it can help ensure the people who provide medical, mental health, and dental services have the most complete picture of your health history.


Scanning Process: Our scanning partners have been doing this for over 55 years and scan thousands of pages every day. When they scan your paper health records, the electronic files are safely stored, protected, and backed up on hard drives.

Privacy Matters: Your health information belongs to you, and we care a lot about your privacy. During the EHR project, keeping your information private is our focus. Health Services make sure your information is safe and only people who are allowed can see it.

Please remember that your paper health records will be kept safe and stored according to the rules that Oregon Department of Corrections Health Services carefully follows for keeping those records.


