Work Orders:

The following is the procedure when requesting plumbing work repairs in your cell housing or work location.

For your cell housing you are to notify your tier officer or Block Sergeant and give a brief explanation of your issue, staff will then submit a work order request electronically. For plumbing issues at your work location (Example) OCE, Culinary, Yard, etc. Notify your staff supervisor they will then submit a work order request electronically.

All work order requests are prioritized based on the nature of the request and current work order load. A dripping cell faucet is considered a low priority but is usually addressed within a week.

Food Theft

Food theft from Culinary is a major problem for the Institution. It impacts our ability to ensure adequate portions of the published menu are available, jeopardizes the health of individuals taking perishable

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food that is not being properly stored or cooked. It also has a significant effect on our ability to work within our food service budget.

This notice constitutes a direct order that you are not to take any food items from the Kitchen other than uncut fruit in the quantity served (per your AIC Handbook). The following plan was designed to address this issue in a reasonable, consistent way.

1. If an AIC is caught stealing, or attempting to steal food, the food will be confiscated and disposed of accordingly. If the value of the food is less than \$20, the AIC will be issued a minor misconduct report. The minor misconduct report will be for Disobedience of an Order III and will include the cost of all food items that must be disposed of due to the theft/attempted theft or misuse. If the value of the food is \$20 or more, the AIC will receive a major misconduct for Contraband II and will also be charged for the cost of food that must be disposed of.
2. If the AIC stealing the food is assigned to the Kitchen or Dining Room, they will receive a program failure along with the Misconduct Report.
3. This process will be used for foodstuff found outside the Culinary Section (for example cell searches, etc.) if the items can reasonably be determined to have been taken from the Food Services.

Note: This does not prevent a staff member from issuing a misconduct report for a higher level charge (Contraband II) in the event the AIC has received a recent minor misconduct previously for the same conduct.

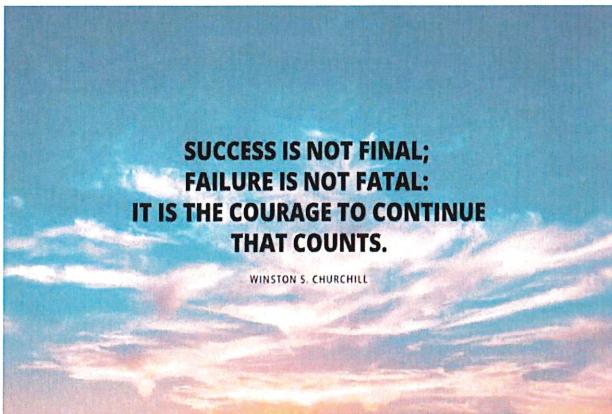

Subject: 2024 Holiday Period

The 2024 Holiday Period begins Monday, December 2, and goes through Friday, January 3, 2025. During this time, for AICs with DOC debt and external obligations, the following parameters will be in place:

DOC Debt and External Obligations

- DOC debt (*examples: disciplinary fines, copy, and postage debt*) will be collected through Wednesday, November 27, 2024, prior to the start of the Holiday Period.
- During the Holiday Period, Central Trust will not collect existing DOC debt.
- External obligations (non-DOC debt) such as court filing fees (County / U.S. Court), garnishment orders, and Court-Ordered Financial Obligations (COFOs) will continue to be collected as DOC does not have the authority to suspend statutory collections.
- At the conclusion of the 2024 Holiday Period, on Friday, January 3, 2025, any funds remaining in the General Spending Trust Account of AICs with DOC debt will be collected in accordance with OAR 291 Div. 158-0065(d).

Spending Funds During the Holiday Period

- Commissary spending limits will be doubled.
- AICs who have DOC debt may spend funds during the 2024 Holiday period from their General Spending Trust Account for the following: postage, copies, institution club & DOC activities, DOC programs, phone transfers, and commissary items.
- AICs with DOC debt cannot make external purchases or disbursements from their General Spending Trust Account during the 2024 Holiday Period.
- AICs should plan accordingly when submitting financial requests, such as commissary orders and Request for Withdrawal of Funds (CD28 or CD28P).

Other Considerations

- All plans are subject to staffing, and AIC commissary worker / supply chain availability.
- Transitional Savings deductions will continue to take place in accordance with ORS 423.105

The Holiday Period occurs at the discretion of the Assistant Director of Operations in accordance with OAR 291 Div. 158-0065(d). AICs with questions may submit an AIC communication to Business Services (*electronic option available on the tablet*).

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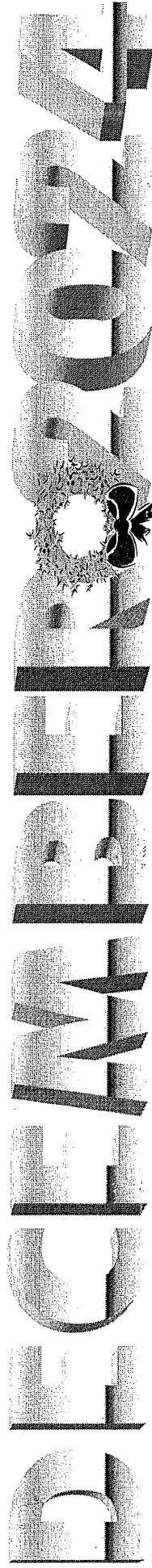
