In order to apply, all of the following criteria must be met (no exceptions): Clear conduct (No Major DR or Program Failures) • Completed and passed Math 70 or above (Must show proof) • High School Graduate, GED, or above • Must already be housed in Complex 1A, 1B, 1C or Minimum • Classification 3 or less • No history of escape or arson • 10 years or less remaining on sentence. This program takes approximately three years to complete (4,000 program hours). If you are interested in this program and meet all of the above requirements, send a completed job application along with an Inmate Communication expressing your interest to Physical Plant (B344). The applications will be screened by members of the SRCI Journeyman Electrical Apprenticeship Subcommittee. Qualified applicants will need to pass a security screening before being contacted for an interview. Applicants will be subject to Drug testing. Applications will be accepted until May 12, 2025.
