PROGRAM OPPORTUNITY

Free Your Mind Core (FYM-CORE):

The curriculum incorporates the latest research on the neuroscience of criminal behavior. Participants learn about the basic brain structures involved in interpreting and responding to environmental stimuli and explore how to use this knowledge to establish new neural pathways and behavioral patterns. The curriculum introduces an innovative (and streamlined) approach to structured skill building. Rather than learning different steps for each social skill, the same four general steps are used to facilitate meaningful repetition of self-control strategies and social skills.

- *FYM consists of 55 sessions for a total of 110 total hours.*
- *Classes are held 4 days a week for 2 hours a day (Tuesday – Friday from 12:30 p.m. to 2:30 p.m.)*
- *Start date in July on the Education Floor*
- *Eligibility: An ACRS of .15 - .70 and a projected release date after December 2025*

Parenting Inside Out (PIO): An evidence-based parenting skills intervention, grounded in adult learning theory and is designed for the adult learner. Throughout the program, the parenting coach and learner collaborate in setting goals and developing strategies for reaching their parenting goals. PIO is an Outcomes-Based Instructional Design (OBID). OBID's focus is on problem-centered, real-life adult roles because adult students are interested in solving problems that relate to day-to-day life.

- *PIO consists of 36 sessions for a total of 108 total hours.*
- *Classes are held 3 days a week for 2 hours a day (Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday. Times are 7:30-10:30 a.m.*

- *Projected start date July 2025, on the Education Floor*
- *Eligibility: Parents with minor children. DHS involved parents are prioritized for placement.*
- *Projected release date after December 2025.*

Heavy Equipment Operator Certification

Baker Technical Institute (BTI) Heavy Equipment Operator Certification Program is coming to OSP. The Department of Corrections has partnered with BTI to offer a virtual heavy equipment operation, industry recognized certification program. Upon finishing the program, students will receive the following certifications: Heavy Equipment Operator Certification, Traffic Control/Flagger Certification - Oregon Department of Transportation, Forklift Certification - Baker Technical Institute, CPR/First Aid/AED Certification - American Heart Association. This program has two time slots either morning or afternoons and will run for 5 weeks starting July 21st.

If you are interested, you must meet the basic qualifications and submit the application to **C. Lenex (CSF) by July 3rd**. Applications are in the housing units and can be obtained from your tier officer.

Basic Qualifications

- Applicant must have the GED or a High School Diploma
- Applicant must have less than 3 years of sentence remaining before release eligibility.
- Applicant must be non-cash incentive level 3. Level 2s will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- Applicant understands that this program is totally voluntary.
- Applicant must not have any security threats that would preclude them from this program.

- Applicant must be security gate cleared.

HEALTH SERVICES

ALLERGY SEASON

Achoo! Sneezing, runny nose, itchy watery eyes, and nasal congestion – it's allergy season.

Oregon is known as one of the worst states for allergy sufferers due to the long growing season. Allergies are particularly bad here in the Willamette Valley with almost 500,000 acres of land used to grow commercial grass seed. We are on the tail end of tree pollen season, but in peak grass pollen levels until about July 4th.

What to do? The canteen offers the allergy medication loratadine which is an antihistamine that helps turn down your body's response to the allergens. If you've tried this and are still having significant symptoms,

Health Services can help. Depending on your situation, you may be prescribed a nasal spray, a different antihistamine, or an increased dose. Oral steroids are reserved for only the most severe cases which are not relieved by other methods. Injectable steroids are NOT recommended to treat seasonal allergy symptoms. Side effects are likely to be more severe from oral or injected steroids than the nasal sprays or antihistamines. Unfortunately, even with multiple treatments, often symptoms cannot be fully relieved.

How can you help? Wash your face at night, minimize outside time when your symptoms are significant and pollen counts are very high, and use your medications as directed. It can take 2-3 weeks to see the full effects of some medications. Use the appropriate channels if you need assistance from Health Services.

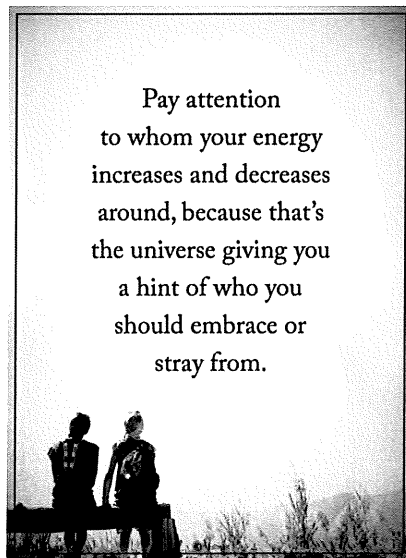

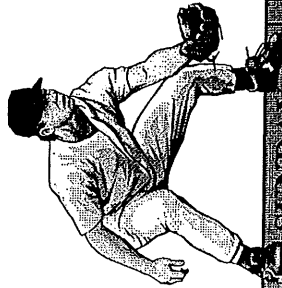

AIC Debt and Obligation Information

Debt / Obligation Type	Collection Schedule	Additional Information
Court Ordered Financial Obligation (COFO)	- Collected from eligible deposits per ORS 423.105 10% collected for COFO(s) from eligible deposits until the transitional savings trust account reaches \$500 - Then, 15% collected for COFO(s) from eligible deposits until obligation(s) are satisfied	- The department does not have case-specific information regarding COFOs; AICs are encouraged to contact the court of record regarding their COFO details - COFOs are not the same as County and US Court filing fees. Examples of COFOs are restitution, fines, fees, & child support - COFOs will continue to collect during the Holiday Buying Period
<i>Note: Although the transitional savings trust account is considered an obligation, funds collected are owned by the AIC. Per ORS 423.105, 5% will be collected from eligible deposits and placed into the transitional savings trust account. Funds in the transitional savings trust account are <u>not available until the AIC releases from ODOC custody.</u></i>		
DOC Debt	- Collected from eligible deposits - Additionally, collections shall occur the last business day of the month per OAR 291 Div. 158 if funds are available	- DOC debt includes but is not limited to debt incurred from various disciplinary fines, copy, and postage advances - DOC debt is due upon receipt; if/when funds are not available; funds are advanced and set-up as debt - Monthly, AICs may spend up to \$40 of the first \$80 deposited into general spending - DOC Debt may be suspended during the Holiday Buying Period unless a new disciplinary fee is applied
County Court Deferred Filing Fee Obligation	- Collected as funds become available - Multiple collections may occur throughout the month - Additionally, collections shall occur the last business day of the month	- County obligations refer to deferred county filing fees - These obligations are incurred when an AIC elects to file with the court and the court approves a deferred filing fee - County Court fees will continue to collect during the Holiday Buying Period
Initial Federal / US Court Filing Fee Obligation	- Collected as funds become available - Multiple collections may occur throughout the month - Additionally, collections shall occur the last business day of the month	- Initial Filing fees can be collected in total and are due upon receipt - These obligations are incurred when an AIC elects to file with the court and the court approves a deferred filing fee - Initial Federal/US Court filing fees will continue to collect during the Holiday Buying Period
Federal / US Court Deferred Filing Fee Obligation	Collected around the beginning of the month	- General filing fee collection amount determined by the previous month's deposit(s) 20% of previous months deposits multiplied by the number of cases is deemed collectable - Federal/US Court Deferred filing fees will continue to collect during the Holiday Buying Period

Note: Debt / Obligation types appear in order of collection priority. ODOC will comply with garnishment orders upon receipt.
