PREA AUDIT NOTICE

There will be a Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) audit here at Snake River Correctional Institution on November 3-6, 2025. This audit will evaluate the facility's compliance with the United States Department of Justice's National Standards to Prevent, Detect, and Respond to Prison Rape under the Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) Standards. At any time, publications that were previously approved, can be re-reviewed and rejected by Central Administration in Salem.

Food Services News

People in the United States consume an average of 3400 milligrams (mg) of sodium daily. ODOC's mainline menu provides a similar amount. The Dietary Guidelines for Americans recommends consuming less than 2300 mg of sodium daily. In an effort to reduce the sodium intake and to promote heart health, Food Services is removing salt from general population dining halls and GP trays. We already add salt to the recipes, so there isn't a need to add more. To adjust the flavor of food to your personal tastes, Commissary offers a variety of spices, including salt to assist you. This change will begin when we switch to the Fall-Winter menu. If you wish to reduce your sodium intake further, here are some different strategies that can be used to do so:

1. Limit or skip high sodium menu items marked with the code (Sod). For example, Salad Dressing (Sod) - 1.00 FL OZ. *Ask for a bowl of beans to replace a high sodium entrée. *Choose the Meat Alternative Tray instead. **2.** Flavor your food with herbs and spices instead of salt. **3.** Use the Nutrition Facts label to choose foods from Commissary with less than 200 mg of sodium per serving.

Seasonal Ice Melt Training for Grounds Crews

Winter is upon us and soon staff and AIC grounds crews will be spreading Ice Melt to counteract the effects of icy conditions and snow. In the next few months please take note of the Ice Melt training to more effectively help with this ongoing winter project.

TRAINING #1 - Care of Spreader and Ice Melt Product - *NOTE* Spreaders range in price from \$150 to \$500* To avoid breaking spreader, please make sure ice melt is stored in a dry area and bag is closed to avoid clumping. Put on rubber gloves and break-up clumps before use in spreader so spreader blades do not break. To avoid using too much ice melt. Place spreader on the setting that sends out the least amount of ice melt. One cup of ice melt equals one driveway or ten (10) sidewalk squares. More is NOT best! **More training to come. Stay tuned!**
