**PREA AUDIT NOTICE**

There will be a Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) audit here at Snake River Correctional Institution on November 3-6, 2025. This audit will evaluate the facility's compliance with the United States Department of Justice's National Standards to Prevent, Detect, and Respond to Prison Rape under the Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) Standards. Any person with information relevant to compliance with the PREA Standards, including information about sexual abuse or sexual harassment of any person at this facility, may ***confidentially*** write to the auditor at:

CONFIDENTIALITY All information received by the auditor is PRIVATE and will NOT be reported to the facility, to law enforcement, or to other authorities UNLESS it is required by law. Legal exceptions to confidentiality include, but are not limited to, the following:

*If the person is in immediate danger to themselves or others (e.g. suicide or homicide) *Allegations of suspected child abuse, neglect, or maltreatment *In legal proceedings where information has been subpoenaed by a court of appropriate jurisdiction.

Reminder From the Mail Processing Center

All publications (magazines, newspapers, and books) are reviewed prior to being tagged and delivered to the AIC population. Having a monthly subscription to any publication does not guarantee that the publication is automatically approved, as each issue is individually reviewed. In accordance with OAR 291-131-0025(12)(c), if mailroom employees determine a publication or specific issue of that publication contains material that is prohibited under these or other department administrative rules, the mail violation and publication violation notice (CD 618a) and prohibited material shall be reviewed by a designated Central Administration official, who will affirm, reverse, or otherwise modify the original rejection decision in writing. For instance, the last issue of Strip LV #223 was rejected due to content. The decision to reject this publication was made by Central Administration in Salem, not at SRCI. At any time, publications that were previously approved, can be re-reviewed and rejected by Central Administration in Salem.

JOB OPPORTUNITIES

Higher Education is looking to hire a team of tutors for its college program. If you would like to join a team dedicated to helping others improve themselves while incarcerated, please send a Kytic to Ms. Davis, Box 215, no later than October 9th. This will be a highly demanding yet rewarding opportunity. We are looking for applicants who maintain a positive attitude, are motivated, and are looking to work in a team setting to benefit not only the students in the program, but the program as a whole. Tutors will be required to work with students of varying backgrounds. This will be in both group and one-on-one settings. Subjects that will require tutoring range from Math 111 to WR 121, and Spanish to Psychology. These are **college level classes**. It is expected that applicants are either already versed in these areas or are willing, and capable, of studying ahead of classes in order to tutor the students.

Tutors will also be tasked with developing and implementing workshops for the students. These include topics such as: time management skills, study habits, and Microsoft Excel, to name a few. Tutors will coordinate with the Lead Tutor to accomplish these workshops. Tutors will also be expected to complete other duties as assigned by the Education Staff, the Lead Tutor, and the College Clerks. The Minimum requirements in order to apply are *No major DRs in the last 12 months. *NCI level 2 or 3 *No major negative remarks by staff *6 months Program Failure Free *At least 90 days at SRCI. Once a Kytic stating your interest is received, you will receive an application. Once this application is then turned in, you will be placed on a callout to interview for the position.

SRCI Physical Plant has an opening on a Electrical Crew. In order to apply, all of the following criteria must be met (no exceptions) • Clear conduct for 1 1/2 years (No Major DR or Program Failures) • Must already be housed in Complex 1-A, 1-B, or 1-C • Classification 3 or less • No history of escape, or arson • 10 years or less remaining on sentence. You must have a general knowledge of all hand power tools, basic knowledge of electrical test equipment, basic mechanical skills, work well with others, able to complete assigned tasks, and able to troubleshoot problems on equipment, able to physically push a maintenance cart up and down hills. If you are interested in this program and meet all of the above requirements, send a completed Physical Plant Work Assignment Application; along with an Inmate Communication expressing your interest to Physical Plant (B344). The applications will be screened by members of the Physical Plant staff. Qualified applicants will need to pass a security screening before being contacted for an interview. Submit applications by October 10, 2025.
